# ENDANGERED: BLACK FARMING

Of the 70,000 farms in the state of Illinois today, only 188 are owned by Black farmers. This is a stark contrast to 1920 when 890 farms were owned and operated by Black farmers in Illinois. Across the nation, black farmers have decreased by 98% between 1920 and 1997.

# NEEDED AREAS OF SUPPORT

### LAND

Retain existing farmland while securing/regaining addition land to farm, heirs property support

LENDING Provide great

Provide greater access to capital providers that offer appropriate and fair financial products that support regenerative farming efforts

EQUIPMENT
Increase equipme

Increase equipment access for small holder farmers via sponsored Share/Lease/Purchase programs

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DEVELOPMENT

Support policy, tax incentives; and federal and grant opportunities that grow local equitable agro-economies

MARKETS

Encourage the reconnection of <u>local</u> rural and urban food producers, distributors, processors and markets to support greater regional foodshed resiliency
