

David Colander is the Christian A. Johnson Distinguished Professor of Economics at Middlebury College, Middlebury, Vermont. He has authored, co-authored, or edited 30 books and over 100 articles on a wide range of topics. These include *Principles of Economics* (McGraw-Hill), *History of Economic Thought* (with Harry Landreth) (Houghton Mifflin), *Macroeconomics* (with Ed Gamber) (Prentice Hall), *Why Aren't Economists as Important as Garbagemen?* (Sharpe), and *MAP: A Market Anti-Inflation Plan* (with Abba Lerner) (Harcourt Brace Jovanovich).

He received his Ph.D. from Columbia University and has taught at Columbia University, Vassar College, the University of Miami, and Princeton University as well as Middlebury College. In 2001-2002 he was the Kelley Professor for Distinguished Teaching at Princeton University. He has been on the board of numerous economic societies and has been Vice President and President of the Eastern Economic Association and Vice-President of the History of Economic Thought Society. He is currently on the editorial boards of the *Journal of the History of Economic Thought*, *Eastern Economic Journal*, and *Journal of Economic Perspectives*. He is also series editor, with Mark Blaug, of *Twentieth Century Economists* for Edward Elgar Publishers.
