

Martin N. Baily is a senior fellow at the Brookings Institution. He rejoined Brookings in 2007 to develop a program of research on business and the economy. He is studying the financial crisis as well as productivity and technology. Baily is also a senior advisor to McKinsey's Global Institute, an adviser to the Congressional Budget Office and a director of The Phoenix Companies. He serves as the co-chair of the Pew Task Force on Financial Sector Reform and is a member of the Squam Lake Group. He was a senior fellow at the Peterson Institute from 2001 to 2007. Baily was the chairman of the Council of Economic Advisers and a member of the Clinton cabinet from 1999 to 2001. He has taught at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Yale University and the University of Maryland, and is the author of many articles and books. Baily earned his Ph.D. in economics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.
