

Christopher Sands is a senior fellow at the Hudson Institute, where he specializes on Canada and U.S.–Canada relations, as well as North American economic integration. He is also a professorial lecturer at the Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS), an adjunct professor in government at the American University School of Public Affairs and lectures at the Foreign Service Institute of the U.S. Department of State and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. Sands serves as a senior associate of the Center for Strategic and International Studies, and is a member of the Research Advisory Board of the Macdonald–Laurier Institute. His recent publications include *Toward a New Frontier: Improving the U.S.–Canadian Border* and *The North American Auto Industry under NAFTA* (with Sidney Weintraub). In 1999–2000, Sands was a Fulbright scholar and visiting fellow at the Norman Paterson School of International Affairs at Carleton University in Ottawa. Sands holds a B.A. in political science from Macalester College and an M.A. and Ph.D. in Canadian studies and international economics from Johns Hopkins University–SAIS.
