David Autor is an associate professor of economics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and a faculty research associate of the National Bureau of Economic Research. Mr. Autor is currently engaged in two research programs: one on the growth of labor market intermediation; and the second on job skill demands, technological change, and earnings inequality.

Mr. Autor received a B.A. in psychology, with a minor in computer science from Tufts University in 1989, and a Ph.D. in public policy at Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government in 1999. He is also the recipient of an NSF CAREER award for his research on labor market intermediation and an Alfred P. Sloan Foundation Fellowship.

Prior to obtaining his Ph.D., Mr. Autor spent three years directing efforts in San Francisco and South Africa to teach computer skills to economically disadvantaged children and adults. He also pursued two previous careers, one in computer programming and the other in food service.
