

### **Burt S. Barnow, Ph.D.**

Burt S. Barnow, Ph.D. is associate director for research and principal research scientist at the Institute for Policy Studies at the Johns Hopkins University; he also has a joint appointment with the Department of Economics. Dr. Barnow has over 30 years of experience as an economist and manager of research projects in the fields of labor economics and program evaluation. He joined the Institute for Policy Studies in 1992 after working for eight years at the Lewin Group and nearly nine years for the U.S. Department of Labor.

Dr. Barnow's current and recent research includes: an impact evaluation of the Department of Labor's High Growth Training Initiative, evaluating training and social service programs for refugees for the Office of Refugee Resettlement, a study for the U.S. Department of Labor on the implementation of the Workforce Investment Act, an evaluation of a Department of Labor demonstration project to help youth in foster care make the transition into the labor market, and a study for the U.S. Department of Labor of the feasibility of determining unit costs for the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) program. Dr. Barnow has been published widely in the fields of labor economics and evaluation. He has a B.S. degree in economics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, as well as M.S. and Ph.D. degrees in economics from the University of Wisconsin at Madison.
