Alan Berube is Research Director and Fellow at the Brookings Institution Metropolitan Policy Program. His areas of expertise include urban and suburban demographics, and social policies affecting urban low-income families and communities.

Alan's most recent work includes research on the causes and consequences of concentrated urban poverty in the United States, the role and function of U.S. cities and metropolitan areas in a globalizing economy, and the use of low-income tax subsidies, including the Earned Income Tax Credit. He has authored numerous Brookings publications.



Prior to joining Brookings in February 2001, Alan was a policy advisor in the Office of Community Development Policy at the U.S. Treasury Department, and a researcher at the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities. He holds a master's degree in public policy from the Georgetown Public Policy Institute, and a bachelor's degree in chemical engineering from Stanford University. In 2004 Alan served as an Atlantic Fellow in Public Policy at the UK Treasury, focusing on mixed-income housing policy.
