

BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION ON EDWIN MELÉNDEZ

Edwin Meléndez is Professor of Management and Urban Policy at Milano The New School for Management and Urban Policy at the New School in New York City. Originally from Puerto Rico, Dr. Meléndez earned a master's degree in economics from the University of California at Santa Barbara and received his Ph.D. in that subject from the University of Massachusetts Amherst. He has conducted considerable research in the areas of Latino studies, economic development, labor markets, and poverty. In addition to numerous scientific papers and other publications, he is the co-editor of the recently published *Latinos in a Changing Society* (Praeger, 2007), and the author or editor of ten books including *Communities and Workforce Development* (Upjohn Institute: 2004), *Working on Jobs: The Center for Employment Training* (Boston: Mauricio Gastón Institute, 1996), *La Empresa Comunal: Lecciones de Casos Exitosos en Puerto Rico* (Editorial Nueva Aurora, 1999), and *Hispanics in the Labor Force* (Plenum Press, 1991), among others. He has held faculty appointments at Fordham University, the University of Massachusetts Boston, and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.
