

Bruce Meyer, is the McCormick Tribune Professor at the Harris School of Public Policy Studies at the University of Chicago. He was a faculty member in the Economics Department at Northwestern University from 1987 through 2004. He has also been a visiting professor at University College London and at Princeton University, a member of the Institute for Research on Poverty, a faculty research fellow and research associate for the National Bureau of Economic Research, and a faculty fellow at the Institute for Policy Research. He studies tax policy, welfare policy, unemployment insurance, workers' compensation, the health care safety net, and labor supply. His most recent work includes research on measuring poverty in the U.S., the consequences of disability, the effects of welfare and tax reform on the well-being of single mothers, models and methods to analyze labor supply, and the effects of changes in the health care safety net.
