John Tyler is an applied microeconomist who focuses on economics of education-related questions. Much of Mr. Tyler's research has focused on what is happening to low-skilled individuals in today's high-skill economy. He is regarded as one of the nation's experts on the economic returns to the General Educational Development (GED) certificate.

Mr. Tyler's interests also include K-12 school reform issues, program evaluation, and quantitative research methods. An Associate Professor of Education and Public Policy at Brown University, Mr. Tyler received his doctorate from the Harvard Graduate School of Education in 1998.
