

Thomas DeLeire is an assistant professor in the Department of Economics at Michigan State University. His research focuses on labor and health economics. His recent work is on family structure, choice of occupation, health insurance spending, and the well-being of poor households. In other work, he has examined the impact of overtime regulations on hours of work, the effect of the Americans with Disabilities Act on the employment of disabled citizens, the extent to which disabled workers face wage discrimination by employers, and the role that tax-favored savings accounts play in increasing national savings. From 2002 to 2003, he was Senior Economist for labor, health, and education for the Council of Economic Advisers and he has previously taught at the University of Chicago and Harvard University. He received his AB from Princeton University in 1990 and his PhD in economics from Stanford University in 1997.
