Daniel Sullivan is vice president and economic advisor in the Economic Research Department of the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago. Mr. Sullivan is the team leader of the applied microeconomics group. His research is in the area of labor economics, especially issues relating to displaced workers and alternative work arrangements.

Prior to joining the Chicago Reserve Bank, Mr. Sullivan was an assistant professor of economics at Northwestern University. He has also taught at Princeton University. Mr. Sullivan received an A.B. degree in mathematics and statistics from the University of Chicago and a Ph.D. in economics from Princeton University. He has published articles in the *American Economic Review*, the *Journal of Law and Economics*, the *Journal of Economic Perspectives*, the *Journal of Industrial Economics*, *Econometrica*, and the *Journal of Political Economy*.
