Scott has published widely in academic journals and the popular press, including the *Journal of Policy Analysis and Management*, *International Review of Applied Economics*, and *Stanford Law and Policy Review*, as well as the *Los Angeles Times*, *Newsday*, *USA Today*, *Baltimore Sun*, *Washington Times*, and other newspapers. He has also provided economic commentary for a range of electronic media, including NPR, CNN, MSNBC, Bloomberg, and the BBC. Scott has a PhD in economics from the University of California at Berkeley, and a BS in engineering from Washington University in St. Louis.
