

Carla N. Little, Ph.D. is the state strategic national stockpile program manager with the Illinois Department of Public Health's Office of Preparedness and Response. In this position, she develops strategies for the State's Medical Countermeasures Distribution and Dispensing Plan, oversees and coordinates the Cities Readiness Initiative, manages the Illinois Pharmaceutical Stockpile and ChemPack programs. Her responsibilities include: writing and updating the state's SNS plans; coordinating with the eight State of Illinois agencies responsible for developing strategies for a 48 hour state-wide distribution of medical materiel; coordinating with local and federal partners on SNS planning and; ensuring that medical countermeasures are in place for prophylaxis of our state SNS first responders during a public health disaster.

Little previously served as a laboratory research scientist in virology with the Illinois Department of Public Health's Office of Health Protection, Division of Laboratories. In this position, she was involved with the research, development, and validation of new technologies that aid in the expedient diagnosis of infectious viral agents. In addition, Little served as the assistant responsible officer for select agents and assisted with laboratory preparedness staff development and training.

An active member of her community, Little serves as a member of the Woodland Community Consolidated School District 50 Board of Education and as a board member/scientific advisor for the Chocolate Chips Association. She also chairs the Association for State and Territorial Health Officials (ASTHO) SNS Steering Committee.

Little received a B.S. in life science, with a minor in chemistry, and a B.S. in science education from Indiana State University. She earned her doctorate in molecular biology from Purdue University. Little was recently awarded the Lake County YWCA Women of Achievement Award in Science and Technology in recognition of her career and community accomplishments.
